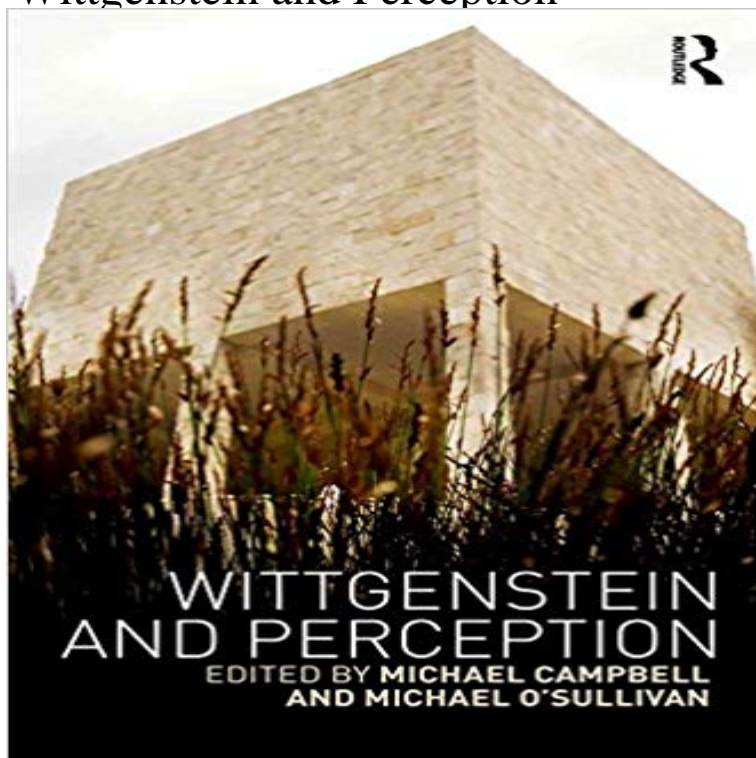


Wittgenstein and Perception
